

Who are we?

he Australian Conservation Foundation has been campaigning for an environmentally sustainable Australia for nearly 25 years. We are non-profit, independent, national and democratic. Our only obligation is to the environment. Our 60,000 supporters include 20,000 members, and our numbers grow daily.

We have campaign offices in all states and a national lobby office in Canberra. We have more than 70 staff working onenvironmental campaigns, research, policy development, marketing, membership services and promotion of public awareness with the much needed support of volunteers, ACF branches and campaign groups. We are funded almost entirely by membership fees, donations and the sales of ACF products and publications. Less than a tenth of our

funding comes from government and other grants and those, typically, are directed toward specific projects.
