FRED PREFERS FISH FINGERS

Last week Councillor Fred Farrell who represents Windsor ward on the Prahran Council announced that he will no longer eat the banquet provided for councillors at the Prahran Council's fortnightly meetings.

Fred Farrell said that the banqu t, which is supplied out of council funds, consisted of a four course meal starting with a dozen oysters in the shell and finishing with drinks. He estimated the cost of the banquet at \$100 per fortnight.

Fred's campaign against misuse of council funds in a municipality largely composed of migrants, workers and pensioners has not been confined to the compatively trivial issue of the council plutocrats providing themselves with free food and grog. Fred stood on a radical pensioners ticket in the council elections last year and with the support of pensioners and the creek community managed to defeat the usual gaggle of estate agents and merchants.

Fred has plans to expose the deep - seated corruption in the Prahran council, and soon hopes to have details about amounts of money changing hands in relation to the building of service stations in Prahran.
