The Case Against Nuclear Power

The near-meltdown of the Three Mile Island nuclear reactor in Pennsylvania in 1979 showed people around the world the danger of this deadly energy source. Yet for the \$150 billion US nuclear industry, it was just a public relations setback.

This book shows that the accident was not an isolated event but just the latest in three decades of nuclear disasters.

It explains the threat of radiation and the nuclear fuel cycle, and also looks at the broader issues: where the nuclear industry came from; the fraudulent "energy crisis" which is supposed to make nuclear development necessary; nuclear power in the Soviet Union; and the movement of opposition to nuclear development.

Special attention is devoted to the part that working people can and need to play in closing down the industry, from the uranium mines of Australia to the reactors of North America and around the world.
