One of his followers, Frank Gilbreth, refined Taylor's methods. He broke every work activity into 19 basic actions, such as reaching, gripping, twisting, pressing etc, and countless sub-actions.

To each, Gibreth assigned a unit of time modestly called the "Ther big"—his own name spelt backwards. From this, the modern time-and-motion study was born. born.
Taylor's methods spread like wildfire through Western industry in the early.
20th century. F FREDERICK Taylor was the father of speed-up, Henry Ford was his apple-cheeked boy.

In 1908, when Ford launched his Model T, highly ternatile mechanics would assemble each car in small teams. Demands for the 1908 Model T was so great that Ford engaged engineers to completely overhaul his production. Office workers as well as factory hands were subjected to the stopwatch Typewiter companies started fitting their machines with stroke-counters so that typists' efficiency could be measured.

Controlling the speed of the belt allowed Ford to double and triple the

rate at which his worken performed.
Having seized control of the speed of
the job, Ford was able tedo away with





IN THE early 1970s with the rise of women's liberation, we learned just how strong and militant women can be. And we've had many more lessons in recent years, the nurses' industrial action in three states being the latest case.
