EQUALITY FOR ABORIGINES

Land Rights Report comment by Dr HANNAH MIDDLETON

The second report of the Aboriginal Land Rights Commission — the recently released Woodward report — goes some way towards the goal of restoring equality and dignity to the Aboriginal people, but it has some very significant weaknesses.
