

BLACK ROSE

Well, here we are three months on, with the smells of change in the air at Black Rose. Suprisingly enough, sales seem to have improved to what may be sufficient to put us in the Black(sic). From what I've heard he's being overloaded with all his committments; to alleviate this, and ensure the distribution of the stock CHEAPLY, he has offered records to us and Phantom, who seem to totally taken advantage of his dedication, and not passed the savings onto the beloved consuming public... so, don't give the bastards your money; come to us! If you know that Greg gets what you want, then it may be worth waiting 'til we score it from him, so that he doesn't have a billion small orders; we intend to reorder every 60 days.

S0000.... many thanks to Greg for his rare dedication and damn hard work, we all have a lot to thank him for. Thanks also

to everyone who helped out with the last benefit-sometimes more that is fair to ask... you know who you are. xox

If you would like to help out, we need/desire the following... odds and ends for a garage/Black Elephant sale, a set of bookshelves for the library, someone to connect the stove and reconnect an old light fitting in the main shopfront window (electricians that is!!!) As usual any donations do go a long way a phonecall needs either a .25¢ donation or a \$1.25 sale... interesting really! Something we have been discussing is asking for rent pledges, \$5-\$10 weekly or monthly from enough people to cover the \$670/month rent (cheap yes, but still too much!); this could be saved by consuming more wisely/ecologically/healthily; sure it can be a damn hassle, but I reckon that it's worth it for a lot of reasons.

thta it's worth it for a lot of reasons, even you don't pass the savings onto a "cause" you don't need a job to do this, even though the amount of dole does stink I think thta Black Rose is important and that's why I say this shit.it's NOT a guilt trip, just a hard reality the shop is facing: it will go under unless something changes. Why not organise a fund raising collective, gigs with food and raffles... allocating the money to various anarchist/related projects, in a regul

IDEAS FOR EDITORIAL GUIDELINES

For the past two issues of the Sydney Anarchist Newsletter there have been a number of issues and problems raised, which relate to editorial policy, lay out and on what basis contributions were included/excluded. At the last Anarchist Powwow a group of people volunteered to work on a draft of editorial guidelines; in an effort to address and deal with these problems. We talked, argued, laughed, cried, whipped ourselves and came up with these suggestions to be discussed at the next Pow-wow:

FOCUS

The Sydney Anarchist Newsletter is to focus primarily on local news and events of the anarchist community in Sydney. It aims to let people know what's going on and how they can get involved.

FORMAT

- *A5 format to be kept as it's a good size for local news and reports
- *The format is open to change e.g. to A4 size.
- *Contact list and "what's on" to be kept as a regular thing.
- *The size of the print has to be kept readable (9 point or above). Copies enlarged to A4 size to be available on request.

CONTRIBUTIONS

- *Articles to be typed and layed out in A5 format (with 1cm borders) wherever possible.
- *Contributors to give a contact number or address for the editorial collective that will be kept confidential.
- *Specify if letters are for publication.
- *It's important for contributions to come in before the deadline or that the editorial collective is contacted about late submissions.
- *An A5 page limit on contributions in general.
- *Adds for local non-profit groups to have a size limit of half an A5 page.
- *If people want their contributions returned to include a stamped, self addressed envelope.

EDITORIAL COLLECTIVE

- *Priority will be given to reports and articles on local news and events in Sydney anarchist community
- *Preference may be given to articles typed and layed out in A5 format due to time and space limits.
- *All collective members have to agree on a contribution being excluded.
- *There is no obligation on the editorial collective to print all contributions.
- *If someones contribution hasn't been published and they want to know why they can contact the editorial collective via the media room (c/o-110 Crystal St, Petersham, 2049. Ph 5646413)
- *If the content of a contribution is to be changed the person is to be contacted and if time allows to be returned to the person to be changed and resubmitted.
- *Editorial collective to rotate with assistance from previous collective.
- *To keep an ongoing diary about process and problems. For each editorial collective to record information to help future collectives.
- *All things relating to the newsletter to be kept at the media room. *A disclaimer to be included.

Finding ways of supporting ourselves and enjoying life at the same time is not easy, especially if we want to be ethical about it. As a lot of us know, the dole is not the straightforward proposition it once was. A workshop run by Lillian Geddes at Jura Books on Tuesday July 13 focussed on stuff like this, and looked at how non-profit projects like Black Rose and Jura might be able to pay their workers.

Lillian had some good ideas for working alongside other people without too much conflict and also talked about housing co-ops. It would have been good to get down to the nitty-gritty on some of these issues but so many broad

questions kept coming up. Is it better to work in groups or independently? Should projects like the bookshops pay workers or should they be volunteer-run? There was a lot of discussion around all this, and some talk of co-ops that have worked well overseas. Some of Lillian's suggestions challenged our ideas on the way anarchists should organise.

Despite the fact that it was a rainy, miserable night, a lot of people attended, which shows how many of us are into being self-supporting and looking at different ways of working together.



MAILBAG MMMMM



Isn't it interesting how often it is men who see maintaining health as a luxury (rather than a necessity) and use class politics to disguise their laziness about food preparation and their fantasies about apron-clad women serving them chops.
