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


# EDITORIAL

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## an Open Letter to Sydney Anarchists and Like minded people

Well this letter may not go down very well with some anarchists as one of the trends amongst anarchists in Sydney is to emphasise the new; along with the progress we're making, while at the same time ignoring the many problems we also have that need confronting. I am not trying to point my finger at any one individual or group through this article, rather I am aiming to make some general criticisms which I believe all anarchists should take a look at and think about.

There is little or no push within the anarchist movement towards recruiting new people. Consequently, outsiders see little encouragement to become involved. If new people don't get involved we will become obsolete. We also become irrelevant to any up and coming radicals and revolutionaries. I believe that part of the problem here is that many anarchists have an anti-lefty mentality which, for some reasons, means that they must act in completely the opposite way and rely on people just dropping by out of interest. Recruiting needn't be high pressure tactics but can simply be a conscious act of 'spreading the word' with a view to encouraging people who are not involved to become involved in anarchist action and organisation

Another idea is that many anarchists hold: that change will come from anarchists and anarchist groups. I believe this to be a big mistake as change has always come from the mass of people: the working class and their middle class allies. In any movement for social change those anarchists that activist-oriented will make up a militant section of that movement. So let's not kid ourselves, we can't change jack shit on our own, isolated from the community at large. We must reach out to others - always - because we have as much to learn from the working class as they have from us.

And again: that somehow our counter-culture will permeate society in large sections and she'll be right mate. I see a counter culture as having a vital role in establishing rebellious elements and ultimately autonomous zones in the wider community. It's important here to realise that a counter-counter cannot sustain itself, it must be sustained by those who want and need it. However, if building a counter-culture is nothing more than life-styling, that is politics without activism, it's destined to become next years fashion and ought to be dead and buried.

To bring people over to revolutionary ideas basic propaganda work needs to be done. This means dirty work like paste-ups for example. If you're serious about our movement and want to see numbers grow you'll have to take on the not so nice jobs as well as the nicer ones. Our ideas and methods of action are not on display for the wider community to scrutinise and need to be if we really want to share our views, hopes, dreams, fun, work and whatever else may spring to mind. Few people come looking for revolutionary ideas - you have to take revolutionary ideas to them.

More discussion and debate between ourselves on what we think and why we think it will push us to a better understanding of why we do what we do. Cutting across the borders that the Black Rose/Jura split created, we have been able to come together to organise a particular event or action. But because we often haven't done

any talking about what we think and why we think it some of our actions have fallen apart at the seams. Take last year's squatting actions: we packed it in after two weeks. Our group fell apart for two reasons: a lack of commitment to a long term campaign and a lack of common thinking (theoretical unity).


Our movement lacks the funds to stand on its own two feet. The various projects being run by anarchists (with the exception of Jura Books) are poorly financed and this shows - in what we offer and what we produce. We need methods to finance our operations and this means new ideas and individuals with enthusiasm for carrying them out. There ARE more ways to make some money than benefit gigs and donations. Not that these methods are useless but they do not completely fill their purpose. We are still short of hard cash.

We need more thought behind our actions and more open debate (formal or informal), not just blind.

Fuck dropping out, it's time to start dropping in.

All of this is meant as a contribution to political thought and action amongst anarchists in Sydney. It's not meant as a denunciation, on the contrary, it's subjective analysis. In overall terms: I am part of what I criticise.



# The politics of food, steps towards being effective, and food co-ops.

This article is about many things, I don't have the space to deal with them all, let alone effectively. Yet it touches on some of the most important and intimate aspects of our lives, and how large companies are invading and colonising them; the land of indigenous, and disenfranchised people; ecological systems and sustain ability of life that is a part of these complex inter-dependent systems. I encourage you all to inform yourselves more about all these issues from the large range of material available, but most importantly of all, to get involved in the sourcing and production of your own food.

Recycling is a load of shit, one of the best ways that capitalism has tried to defuse the environmental time bomb (or is that dam the floods of change), that threaten to dethrone them. Re-use is one way of taking it a step further, it is not the final answer by any means, but a significant step in the right direction. We still have to deal with the problems associated with poor land use and distribution, here and in the mal-developed parts of the world that continually lead to unemployment (deadly in some countries-even by U.S. supplied machine guns<sup>2</sup>), and a host of other ills, that strangely enough always seem to make the rich richer, poor poorer, and everyone else generally more reliant on their filthy system.

Come along to Alfalfa Haus, and see what we are doing to (organically) fertilise the seeds and winds of change. Sure some of the stuff comes from places like Chile, and other sub-fascist states, but we are constantly trying to source new growers and suppliers that can bring us foods that are organically grown and processed, as locally as possible: especially if collectives, co-ops, small holders etc. are involved at every step of the process. We now make calico bags in a variety of sizes. Almost all your food can now be supplied by the co-op, and although it is not strictly anarchist, it is very friendly and compatible with our ideas. The more anarchists take part, the more anarchist it will be. Important too is the fact that it is an actual manifestation of workable models of community food distribution and empowerment. A way of participating and putting into effect ideas, instead of pretending to be "P.C"(a huge joke if ever there was one), by just waffling on and saying really radical things.

It's not that difficult to join and you need not have loads of time to spare, which many of you have heaps of anyway. So come along, the co-op is open Tues. to Sat. now and needs active MEMBERS, not merely shoppers, but members. Stop being a spectator on your own lives, and regain control in an important way. I hope to see you there. Nick, one of the many weekly co-ordinators. Call us on 519-3374, or pop in.

<sup>3</sup>as an aside, the term politically correct was originally used by Fascists to make fun of the lack of autonomy in authoritarian socialist circles, a strength for fascists but logical inconsistency for revolutionaries. I believe that this is still evident in modern social engineering with the issue selection and narrowing that goes on today, where we even hear politicians talking of the politically correct thing to do, as if doing something because opinion makers say it's important is more appropriate than extending anarchist principles to an issue and deciding for ourselves the most reasonable and informed stance and action. It is used to end debate and enforce conformity to a party line by self appointed experts.

This is the first report of Coalition Against police Violence Sydney cell (sic). So far I am the only member. I will be focusing on a number of aspects of police violence as it manifests in our society, wider in scope than the other cells, yet still appropriate in my view. I am maintaining the original name out of respect to the founders (Melb. cell). The tremendous effort and courage it took them in the fight to save Shannon Ewart from the viscous corruption and abuse of state power that manifested in her bashing/torture at the hands of a large number of police from Sth Melbourne police stn. in 1991, the subsequent legal farce that imprisoned her and the complicity of the media- during the bashing and her appeal. I will also maintain the name because I will be working closely with the other groups and thus will still be a member of this loose collection of groups and individuals that go into making up the coalition.

I am working on the principle that "police" is any act or manifestation of coercion, that seeks to and/or achieves the submission and obedience of individuals to a hierarchical society, whether it be a family, ideological system, or the forms we are more used to thinking of as "police". Remember the classic graffiti of May '68? "There is a cop inside everyone of us and he must be killed". As a philosophical pacifist, I do not mean this in the literal sense. Not as a tactic of revolution to be used against all manifestations of violence most commonly manifested in spouses, fathers and those eternal bogies (sometimes called "maternal enemies of the people" by anarchists and others). What I do mean is that we should seek to remove that "copness inside all of us that stops us from living in a free society, so that there is no place for cops in uniforms, be they blue shirted, or collared.

I do not support terrorism. (retail or wholesale.<sup>1</sup> I.), guerillaism, or any other vanguardist violence. The only forms I would even contemplate supporting, let alone participating in, is widespread insurrection, which requires widespread participation and support of the great mass of down-trodden and oppressed. For further details see the excellent pamphlets "You can't blow up a social relationship: the Anarchist case against terrorism." and a number of other pamphlets and books in the Black Rose library. My writings will hopefully appear in a variety of anarchist and non-anarchist publications, consisting of theory, facts, accounts of police violence, calls for help (people are always more welcome than their money, but it's better than nothing!), and rumours of proposed and alleged defiance to this system of violence and oppression that is self-perpetuating and self-serving.

My first proposed action was to be a commemoration of the massacre at Carandery (22), the largest penitentiary in South America, Brazil. It occurred on October the second nineteen-ninety two, most of the inmates were not even sentenced yet. It is a classic example of state terror and I fear that these types of oppressions will become more common as the masks of our Imperialist overlords are exposed; as we show them for the callous murders in pursuit of profits that they are. The more we know, the less valuable to the propaganda system is our safety and individual sovereignty. I learnt of this in all places in a song by Brazilian hardcore band SEPULTURA, I highly recommend them. I hope that in talking of this, that I do not appropriate the suffering of these defenceless victims of violence unleashed. Their bodies were not even spared the indignity of a mauling by police dogs. I believe that it is essential to draw the links between the increased use of military forces in civilian roles, and the blurring of civilian police with the military. This case demonstrates it unquestionably (unless you happen to be a state propagandist). This is bloody scary and affects us all, as the globalisation of Imperial power escalates. Even with the blinding arrogance of the American regime and it's client states, we must not however fall into the trap of focusing on the spectacular if it distracts us from pressing issues closer to home, as the recent trip to Bougainville of some of our brave comrades attests, or even closer yet paradoxically less cared about seemingly, genocide of Australia's indigenous people. Remember. Solidarity=Survival. Please contact me via Black Rose to get involved.

# BLACK ROSE REPORT.

Welcome to the spring spiel. Much has been going on since I last wrote. The major order we have been waiting on from our major supplier of anarchist texts has not come (ordered a year ago now!) This has caused us considerable hardship in filling orders and so on, but good news is that we are now sure that it isn't somewhere in the middle of the ocean, allowing us to place the order, now out of date, with someone else. so the shop shelves wont be so embarrassingly empty. We are developing a better ordering structure, both for ourselves, and in partnership (not in the legal sense though) with the other Anarchist Bookshops, most notably Holus Bolus who we will be doing two joint orders with by the end of the year., for these we may need people who are trustworthy and reliable to courier them from them to us, and vice-versa, when the stock arrives (that's if you happen to be travelling between cities at the time, please contact us if you think you can help.)

We hope to be fixing set dates or close enough, for our benefits in future, four gigs a year, with at least one falling on the shop's birthday, which has not happened this year. Our calculations show that this would cover any loss due to overheads; please participate if you can:- cooking, setting/packing up, poster design and runs- you name it, it needs to be done, and we sure could use the occasional hand, but sometimes it's really hard to ask, I know that I find it easier, when people offer, but then I am a shy bastard. Apart from gigs it would be nice to have dinners (monthly/quarterly?) again, but we would have to know that the effort was worth it, I know that I'd like them to raise at least \$60 a go to be bothered cooking, when I could hang out with my friends instead. They are a great way to meet anarchists, and other less labelled creatures that we might not know very well, if at all; as contributing to the spectacle as it might sound, a film ( or a talk perhaps?), is a great focus for calm debate, or to make it through those silent bits in conversation that can be a bit dull, but enough of that (for now), if the idea interests you let us know, because we do miss the dinners, and would love to do them again, if they were supported.

I am also starting a few fund raising initiatives of my own; first off is a raffle, with tickets at one dollar each. The prize is a gift voucher for fifty dollars to be spent here, basically we'll divide the money in half, for the shop and the prizes, so that's a one in a hundred chance. If you think that we should divvy it up differently, let us know, as this will basically be an ongoing venture, so far about thirty tickets have ben sold.

We are still offering a mail drop service for groups and some individuals, so long as nothing dodgy is sent to the shop. We will charge about \$10.00/year (except for anarchist projects), compared to the \$30 odd that oz post charges.

We need some postal tubes, or other good devices to store the shop poster stock in. This would prevent it from being damaged, as the last lot were soiled in the fire and have not been adequately replaced. Something that keeps them flat and doesn't take up much shop space would be ideal.

Tony has kindly designed a new Black Rose screen print, which will be available soon, if you would like to do something like this, we are able to provide materials, so that you are not out of pocket.

We really want Black Rose to be more of a community centre of sorts (on my part, I will try to bring in some cakes to share-for a small donation, to help achieve this goal). This would help justify the expense of having a shopfront more. Since anarchism is about communities taking control, and creating autonomous zones (as a process of revolution), why not participate in organising more action and activity here (since there definitely aren't enough going on)? Some days, it seems that all we are doing, is allowing people to consume more by working for free, which seems especially gross as the stuff we provide will hopefully bring about a sustainable anti-consumption society. This is just honest opinion and not a pathetic whinge.

Further on that note, an idea I've been mulling over is to start running an Anarchist university/school/education zone (or whatever you want to call it) at the shop. We have all the resources we need right here. An ever expanding library, a computer (spare modem anyone?), and so on. It's something the socialists have been doing for years, and it's a really good way of sharing our resources, knowledge and motivation, and most important of all - getting back to the oral tradition that was so much a part of the anarchist movement in the past- definitely a lot less elitist and alienating than a pile of books. It wouldn't be anything formal, (in the sense of hierarchy). We all have gifts and knowledge that is valuable. It could be regular. I am willing to participate every week on my shifts, and even for an hour or two before or afterwards

As I mentioned in the last newsletter, we have been doing a lot more business with Spiral Objective; this has been very successful, and we are well on the way to having an excellent and efficient system going. So stop buying your records at other places, if the only thing they care about is your money, then why give it to them? We may not always be as fast, but that's because we are a collective and amateurs at that (even with almost three years under our belts on average). Oh yeah we now pretty much deal with him exclusively for American stuff, and if we can't get the stuff from him there is a good chance that the band or label is a sell-out scum one! So don't bother getting it at Moneyfront, or their Max R'n'R, check out the price difference, \$3.45, compared to about \$6-\$9, that can't be only wages and overheads! Anyway enough of that.

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


We've got some excellent new feminist stuff, so if that's your kettle of vegan burgers come in and check it out. We also have a range of excellent anarchist periodicals, which I believe are an effective way of educating ourselves and finding out what's going on around the world, both as inspiration for things to do, and to keep track of the world empires. Most of all I recommend Off Our backs, Fifth Estate and The Shadow from the U.S @; Freedom, Bad Attitude and Workers Solidarity, from the U.K. I want to get proper subs going for them (ie: pay 6-12 months up front, so that we can afford to stock them). Most are \$2 a quarter, plus Phone/post (.40 & .90 respectively). We've had to drop freedom as it wasn't selling, we'd need about 5- 10 people to make it worth while, for between \$50 & \$60 a year each. That is the oldest @ paper in the world and for damn good reason, it comes fortnightly, is about ten broadsheet pages, packed full of comment news and more.

We regret that the shop is now unable to open on Mondays once more, due to lack of collective members. The shop however, remains open pretty much without fail Tuesday to Friday 11am to 6pm and 12pm to 5pm on Saturdays. That's all for the Black Rose report. I hope that you find the information relevant (please tell me if otherwise), as I've sat up all night to meet the deadline..... now to the library report (which was to be a separate article but the other ran over space restrictions).

The library is now partially shelved, and in use. The borrowing system has been fairly random, but all the books bar one have been returned (dear Motorist, an excellent pamphlet). People haven't seemed to minded paying the deposit, generally the price of the item plus \$5-\$10, reducing as they become known to me. No-one has as yet made a donation for the privilege of borrowing, stock expansion, wear and tear. Two books were sold, one by accident and one because the shop was out of stock and it is easily replaced. These aren't problems yet, so the project will continue as it is. range of books is excellent, in quality, size and variety, including practical stuff like the permaculture handbook, which is in the Alfalfa House library. I am still in need of a set of shelves so that the library does not get confused with shop stock; to make it easy on the collective members less familiar with the overall contents of the shop and to preserve the library as a collection. Come in and check it out, preferably on a day that I'm working; ring first as our roster is generally up to a week in advance.) see you 'round. nick of the Black rose.

## **SATURDAY MORNING: LOOKING AT LIFE AND SOCIETY, HOW DID WE GET HERE, WHERE DO WE WANT TO GO?**

General plenary meeting with probably 4 to 6 speakers and general open discussion, critical appraisal of anarchy, possibilities for change in Australia.

Parallel session: Anarchy syndicalism and the idea of class.

## **SATURDAY AFTERNOON: HOW DO WE GET WHERE WE WANT TO GO? IDEAS FOR CHANGING THE WORLD AND CULTIVATING ANARCHY.** Parallel sessions including:

- \* Discussion on intellectuality and free speech.

- \* Workshop and discussion on anarchy and ecology.
- \* Discussion on workplace, community, lifestyle, alternative structures.
- \* Talk - Anarchism or barbarism: structure, hierarchy and chaos.

- \* Anarcho-syndicalism and privatisation.
- \* Talk and discussion about privatisation in Australia Post.

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**SATURDAY EVENING:** Talk by guest speaker Noam Chomsky, Anarchy and visions of Freedom, with questions and discussion.

**SUNDAY: WORKING TOGETHER, ORGANISATION, GROWING OUR CULTURE AND DEFENDING IT.**

Parallel sessions including-

- \* Workshop on anarchist organisation.
- \* Workshop on anarchist book shops/ stalls/ info distribution.
- \* Discussion on anarchy and social control.
- \* Anarcho-syndicalism in Australia, strategy and organisation.
- \* Workshop on networking, creating sustainable cultures.
- \* Videos on Victorian Tram dispute 1990, and Vic Nurses strike 1986.
- \* Workshop on confederation of anarchist groups.
- \* Workshop on building networks & contacts for common campaigns.
- \* Workshop on anarchy and technology.
- \* Workshop on anarchist magazines, radio, tv, computer networks
- \* Discussion about HEMP campaign.
- \* Plenary session.

This is what we have so far, not including other events such as gigs, music, performance and hopefully more films and videos. We would like to be basically a co-ordinating group who will try and organise the venue and any equipment needed, so if you have some ideas on a workshop, or films and videos, want to talk about something or hear what others have to say, let us know. There will hopefully be at least one space available for meetings and workshops that are organised on the day or the day before.

We are also looking at providing lunch on Sat and Sun, plus an evening meal on Saturday, possibly as a benefit to other groups. There are no confirmed evening events as yet, apart from the Chomsky talk, so we would like to hear from anyone who is interested in organising anything such as gigs, parties, performance, exhibitions etc.

Other ideas for workshops include Gender, Sexuality, Education, Drugs, Direct action, Culture, information about any current campaigns or issues, Housing (squatting?) etc.

Garage Sale: \*Has been a successful project for the media room, raising many hundreds of dollars for not too much effort, (not too little either!). \*This will be an ongoing project, currently stored at Black Rose (new home needed soon), available to @ groups/collectives, more donations would be good-no junk please. \*This would be a good way of financing new collectives; ex much talked about Cafes, and HEMP clothing project; however it currently remains under the control of the Pow-wow meetings to avoid abuse of this resource.

Graffiti: \*This is the 2hr program once per month on 2RSR, 88.9fm. it needs more volunteers and source material. \*suggestions included networking with other @ and related radio progs. to swap info and actual recordings, getting our hands on the Barsiaman interviews (Chomsky, and other radicals/activists from U.S.).

Newsletter: collective volunteers; debate on content ensues!

Conference: see else where, to participate and for some of the outcomes. Speculation, over the initial availability of Chomsky as a guest speaker, possibly due to his sponsors wanting to distance him from @ism, as too unrespectable, a pity really when one considers the struggles that @ists have been involved with over the last century and more, the costs paid etc. the bourgeois press have been very effective [I feel that too many @ists succumb to these fabrications as well, confusing bourgeois tendencies with blah blah and in finitum; see the new library up and running at BR@B for more info. eds.]

Open Letter: Agro wrote a letter to stir us up. General discussion not recorded, letter reprinted in the letters column; however the poorly patronised Discussion Groups seem to be an excellent vehicle to solve some of these problems- and also help keep the Pow-wows as a planning/co-ordination group by satisfying the ever distracting ideological debates that seem to pop up here.

Break: 15 mins approx. [Oh yeah lunch was cheap-donation only, and very tasty; however more effort will be put in next time to reduce the plastic content and increase the amount of organic foods etc]



Media Room & related: \* It's all set up and running now, a printer has been purchased with a scanner, modem, dedicated phone line, and internet (or whatever it's called) on the way.

\*meetings are currently fortnightly or so- call 564 6413 for details and updates on what's happening (recorded info)

\*access restricted currently for obvious security reasons (security is top notch at the premises however, being the Jura building), to persons in the collective or otherwise known; we hope to eventually extend services once more reliable people become available to staff the room.)

\*Melb. has public access bulletin board open for 1 1/2 years, under-utilised. Attempts are being made to set up a continual @ Bulletin-board network (@BBS). A 'dedicated' @ network, Aust. wide is on the cards, we have the software, lacking in some knowledge with only the Media Room currently having decent hardware for this of the mentioned @ sites. Ideally they would

be able to offer in shop access to e-mail communications and data bases/networks around the world fairly cheaply. [Very exciting but little progress since in the tech shy/ignorant/marginalised @ milieu. More details in The Anarchist from Brisbane. eds.]

Uranium Policy: \*should we give a voice that uranium should not be mined at all, as the issue was coming up at the next Labour(ing- and corrupt as hell too!) conference in early October, to either keep the current 3 mines policy, or allow the cappo scum to endanger us even more by lifting the restriction. Not much was done in the end publicly. General opinion was that we would be ineffective, and that party/parliamentary politics is crap. However it was also stated that the 3 mines policy came in because of broad based grass roots action against all uranium in the first place [as the murals by the road in Glebe(?) attest. eds.], and not the concern or care of our rulers. [I also note that the campaigns organised by most other groups wimped out at calling only for the existing policy to be held, and not the closure of existing mines. ed]. Perhaps we should be getting involved more directly with these struggles in future, at the very least on a propaganda level, especially with other groups that don't have as firm or radical a stance as @ism should and generally has. The @age weekly & monthly, Rebel Worker, and @ngry People, all spring to mind as excellent platforms (with greater frequency and print space) for this, also greatly in need of patronage, contributors etc. A related issue that came up at the last Pow-wow was a piece of legislation that would greatly increase the TNC control of our food sources, through patents, and disallowing farmers to keep their own seed stock for replanting, forcing them to use input intensive (fertilisers, tractors, pesticides etc.), expensive, hybridised sterile seeds, possibly even genetically engineered stuff. This is the sort of thing going on behind our backs-not just in the U.S. and it's imperial fief. Anyway I've digressed....

Holus bolus: a short run down on how they are doing, including the source of their name, Greek for "everything at once, in it's entirety"

\*Have been a few @BC actions in Melb, picketing Greek airlines Etc over the imprisonment of @ists in Greece.


\*Their will be a "group" in Sydney too, reports/info to be published here, and in other A publications, no new publication to be created- Sydney group will

overlap with a Sydney Coalition Against Police Violence (sort of started, then died last year.) These will be distinctly @ist, and revolutionary.

Aboriginal Deaths in Custody Rally: Ruth brought a stack of leaflets to the meeting encouraging us to attend tis important event. I was going to reprint it in full but unfortunately gave mine to someone else, however I recorded some of the details in my diary:- John Pat died Sept. 28th 1983. Beaten by five off duty, drunk police officers in Roebourne, WA. He suffered TEN blows to the head and a large bruise on the back of his head where he had been kicked. As well he had two broken ribs and a torn aorta. He could not have survived these injuries without major surgery. An all white jury acquitted all five cops. There were fifty-seven witnesses. He had been trying to help his friends, as they were being attacked in full view of the largely black crowd. He was dragged to the police station after being punched and kicked, as he was unable to walk. I can't remember if he was beaten there again, but he was denied treatment, and all the others were bashed again in the station. To date not one cop has been sacked, convicted, or jailed for these deaths in custody, let alone lynched. The indigenous people of Australia need our Solidarity in the face of this vicious, racist, genocidal culture that many of us have been vomited forth from. It is not enough to buy a t-shirt, or a badge. Solidarity is the only hope we all have in the struggle against this Patriarchal, Capitalist society.

Overall it was a successful Pow-wow, we seem to be gradually developing a frame-work for co-ordination of @ist collectives, that increases the accountability and effectiveness of them. This way we can get about the job(ha ha) of building a revolutionary movement, and leave behind the ineffectual clique status that the propaganda mill of State and Capital reduce us to much of the time. I hope to see at the next one, Sunday 11th December, 35 Dixon st. Newtown.

## WINGHAM FOREST ACTION VERSUS PROFIT MAXIMISATION. or CHAINSAW MASSACRE 2.

Court three, the Land and Enviroment Court, 398 George ST. on the left we have council, advisors and witnesses, thirteen in all, representing the Forestry Commission of N.S.W and the National Parks and Wildlife Service, Boral by proxy. These are the brown suit brigade, a particularly uninspiring group of men, who if anything just prove that cloning is alive and well. The saddest and most poignant fact being that they just 'do it' for money. If one has the money then the law is fallable. The Forestry Commission has retained, as senior council, a retired judge of the same court that we are sitting in. Ha, Ha, they laugh.

On the right we have the applicant, a noble, white, geriatric academic in need of a perm, his enterage, non qualified legal team and hangers on come advisors. Which in my less than noble experience includes an ex-concubine of Jim Cairns, quite a few ferals (human), the mother of WFA's self elected and would be barrister ( doing a remarkable job ( not the mother )) and a collection of dope growers who between them, no doubt, make far more from the forest in question than the Forestry Commission ( Boral?) would ever dream of, and for that matter probably employ more people. The difference being that whilst Marihauna compliments the forest and turns it's users into greenies, logging, burning and clear felling have a somewhat detrimental effect on the trees and their inhabitants but does enable Boral to pay a dividend to it's shareholders.

The people ( who care and live local to the war effort ( conflict of interest)) versus big business as represented, of course, by the relevant state govt. bodies. The judge is confronted by anarchy and the old school. Thank the planet that he appears to be into the arts and have a sense of humour.

The case appears to revolve around the fact that in order to make a profit out of chopping down and sawing up one thousand year old trees, the Forestry Commission massacres rather a lot of endangered and soon to be endangered species. And in order that, unlike the rest of us, they do not face prosecution for this blood letting, the N.P.W.S have given them a seemingly unrestricted liscense to kill or take these irrelevant and bastard animals. Now one might ask oneself why the N.P.W.S is thus shooting itself in the furry foot. Political pressure resulting from business lobbying ( in typical luxurious fashion) might have some bearing on this matter but is of course strenuously denied by these highly independant govt. bodies.

Of course, the people, the trees and the animals are witnessing the true purpose of the law. That being a body of the ruling classes and major owners

of the nations wealth setting up a prohibitively expensive system to maintain the status quo and maximise profit, at just about any social and environmental cost. Surprise, surprise, the system appears to be working.

So readers, you can sleep in peace, the endangered species of the forest will live or be massacred on the basis of points of law and the admissability of evidence. And as the people, trees and animals are finding out, getting evidence past a n ex judge of the same court is no easy matter. Sadly I don't expect the premier to instruct the Forestry Commission to stand him down.

My furry friends, the few remaining trees and I are getting rather pissed off, and whilst the gun is a lousy debator, the bleeding heart liberal just sheds the last tear at the final brutality and takes out yet another bank loan. Still, we won't be here for much longer and then of course there will be no problem, or big trees. And the legal system will have worked again, for those that go to the 'right' parties. One gets the impression that for all but the trees and endangered animals in question it is just a joke.

Proposed strategies include:-

#lettersof support for the prisoners; non-political messages to encourage and revitalise hope.

# books and literature to give greater access to education and help fight the soul destroying boredom in the dungeons of the state, probably one of the hardest things for anyone to do there!

# to raise awareness via propaganda, letter writing campaigns, protests and so forth ( like the poorly attended one for Gary Hayes, during his trial last year, and the excellent, but ultimately ineffective-due to lack of consistent follow through- for Shannon Ewart in Melbourne last year.) about the injustice, cruelty and torture perpetrated by the state and it's agents.


Participating in this type of struggle, and often onerous work is an important realisation of solidarity which we should all take part in, as the safety and security of all of us is not ensured when even one of us is oppressed, tortured, humiliated, deprived of even the pathetic rudiments of freedom tolerated by the borgoise elites, and their petit borgoise lackys.

Remember, it could be you, the crimes many of these people are either not real crimes, merely illegal, or worse they have been framed by a corrupt and hypocritical system- can you see yourself getting the same treatment for lieing on your dole or tax form as the mp in melbourne recently. necessities of a decent life, by a maze of concrete walls, iron bars, intimidation, uncaring and oft times brutal cops, a system of lies and deceit, power embodied in the courts, the media, parliament and corporate boardrooms. How will you feel when your time comes, as the gap between the have's and have nots gets wider; the wall between the included and excluded higher. This is real, it is the ugly fist of the state, with the media and a whole bunch of other tricks providing it the smooth velvet glove of friendly fascism, a creeping living death, that sucks us dry and shits us out again.

Solidarity isn't something nice we do in our spare time, it is an act of survival that binds our communities and gives them the strength to face today with the knowledge that, our lives are ours to live as we please; no matter what some dumb arse judge says, or slimy talk-back radio creep bores us with. As many Anarchists have said, there is no life, no happiness outside solidarity and society.
