Crime and Community

We all know that the pigs are useless against crime. Most of the time they are hassling us on the street or sticking their noses in where its not wanted or needed. Most working class people agree that the pigs are scum and should basically be wiped off the face of the earth. But what are the

alternatives? The most common question among our from dirty deeds - far from it. It's class when comes to crime is particular area that ought to be what happens when our shit still gets ripped off, when a people usually have a good idea carload of thugs try of who's up to what and secondly to beat the shit out of us, when my criminals because they will have husband comes home drunk and beats the crap out of me and the kids. when the car has been trashed and the tyres slashed? We still get shat on and the worse part is that it's our own

class brothers and sisters that are doing it to us - the frustration of poverty, work, life and boredom turns us against our own. This is understandable in a society divided by classes but is

NOT ACCEPTABLE.

We already get shat on enough, we don't need people in the same boat as us rubbing it in. We have to direct our anger and criminal activities towards those that deserve it - the wealthy and the rich - and we have to defend our community from scabs. Scabs aren't just those in our class that cross industrial picket lines, we have to have our own class community picket lines where we unite

against anti-social elements that wreck solidarity - we all know what's acceptable what's not. We don't need the ruling class and their middle class lackeys laving down the law and then getting their thugs in blue to make sure we follow their fillthy morals and values.

When we talk about community policing we do not mean the pseudo-Big Brother Neighbourhood

Watch schemes or any other police-controlled scheme where the neighbourhood is supposed to do the dirty work of spying and reporting and the pigs do the rest - we mean real community policing where the community has the real decision making power and ultimately performs an actively policing function - in an organised, voluntary and egalitarian

way. True community policing does not involve extremely hostile stop and search methods, inquisition-style questioning, suspicion, enforcement of petty non-violent "crime" such as loitering, soft drug use, etc but is purely social defence against socially alienating and destructive behaviour such as muggings, rape, domestic violence, burglary, etc

It is obvious to our class that there is a difference between snooping over the fence to make sure our neighbours aren't growing dope and intervening down the road when we can hear the screams of someone being beaten. However to the pigs there appears to be no difference or even a reverse priority. The point is that as a community, we are in a much better situation to know when and how to stop anti-social scabs than a beat cop who is told how and when by his or her superiors who have neither the knowledge of local and personal factors nor the class solidarity to understand what is to be confronted and how best it can be effectively

solved. Community solidarity is the starting point and the ending point to any social policing.

The most effective way to prevent anti-social behaviour is simply looking out for each other in the areasomething we do every day. At times physical confrontation will be necessary to defend our communities and when this has to happen it must include as many people as possible in the process - it has to be voluntary, accountable, inclusive and rotated - if it's left up to the same people and not shared, elitism sets in and we have another set of vigilante cops.

We can start by developing solidarity links with our fellow class comrades in our neighbourhood, building trust so that when physical and practical support is needed in confronting anti-social scabs, it will be there, automatic and effective. Through this we will gain the confidence and assertiveness to actively combat community "crime" and show that our class can and will defend
